Take Up Your Personal Cross Sometimes the truth hurts. But we need to hear the truth anyway. Sometimes the truth brings to light the many problems around us. But we need to hear the truth anyway. Today, despite the fact that Jesus' words may be hard to hear, in the end, they are true. They are good. And they will help us to lead better and more holy lives. Here are some tough words from Jesus: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:27). We love it when Jesus says nice-sounding things, pleasing to our ears, such as: "I am the Good Shepherd" (John 10:14). "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink" (John 7:37).

We like to think of Jesus as making our lives happy, peaceful, and secure. We like to know things will be easy and delightful. But Jesus didn't promise us those things on this side of heaven. In fact, he promised us a share in his Passion! Today, let's acknowledge that the cross of Jesus brings salvation, and all of our personal crosses are a gift to us. They are our share in the Lord's Passion that has been allotted to us. Here are three reasons why the cross is a gift: First,



Jesus' Resurrection reveals to us that after the Passion comes the Resurrection. First the cross, then the glory. The way to heaven leads through Calvary. Second, in every person's life, there will be suffering. No matter what. The question is what we do about it. Illness and death are coming for everyone. We can get angry about this, or we can accept this. It's our choice: resentment or acceptance. The cross of Jesus helps us to face illness and death with peace. Because of his cross, we have eternal hope. Third, embracing one's cross means to bear the weight of life. It is to bear life's sufferings, turning them into good. By carrying our crosses, we become people who give back to the world more than they take. Shouldering our cross makes life deeply meaningful. Imagine what the world could be if everyone took up their cross and tried to make their lives and those around them better! This is the Christian calling, and everyone here in the pews is invited to this Christian way of life.
