Jesus Saves from Close By The conversation we heard in the Gospel, between Jesus and John the Baptist, is a strange one. John was the last prophet. His job was to announce that the long-awaited Messiah, the Saviour, had finally arrived. His job was also to encourage people to repent, to turn their lives around, so that they would be ready to recognise and welcome that Saviour. John used the ceremony of baptism to help that process of repentance, to give people a tangible way to tell God that they were sorry for their sins and wanted to follow him more closely from then on. But Jesus had no sins. Jesus was the Saviour. Jesus had no need to repent, and therefore no need to be baptised. And yet, he shows up by the river and gets in line anyway. John sees him and objects, but Jesus insists on taking his place right beside the rest of the sinners. Why? Because Jesus wants to make sure that we know that he loves us. And so, when he saved us from sin, he did so from close by, from the inside out. He saved us from suffering by suffering himself. He conquered death by dying. He overcame sin by living among sinners. His baptism is a preview of everything that is to come. By getting baptised, Jesus expressed his desire to take our place, to take the punishment for our sins upon himself, so as to free us from them. Later, on the cross, he actually did take them on himself. This was why he came. This was his mission. And this is still his mission. He still wants to save us by coming close to us, to make sure that we know that he loves us.

Christ's baptism remarkably shows all three Persons of the Trinity at the same time: the Son being baptised, the Holy Spirit descending, and the Father speaking from the heavens. In this event, the Father and the Holy Spirit confirm the deity of Christ, and Jesus submits to his Father's will.
